

SALTFLEETBY GAS PRODUCTION.

Ever wondered what goes on at the Saltfleetby gas field ...



WINGAS Storage UK Ltd acquired the asset in 2005 intending to convert the gas field into a gas storage facility, a project requiring a lengthy evaluation and consent process. In the meantime it was decided to recommence production of gas in 2012. The gas and well fluids (condensate and water) are transported by pipeline to the gas treatment plant at Theddlethorpe where the water and condensate (an oily substance similar to crude oil)

are separated from the gas. The gas is treated so that its characteristics fulfil the specifications for use in the National Grid system which supplies domestic and industrial consumers.

Before gas was extracted from Saltfleetby to fuel homes and businesses across the country, it was the largest onshore gas field in the UK.

At the moment, there are around 800 million cubic metres left at Saltfleetby. At current production rates, this is likely to last for about another 10 years.
